Managing native vegetation: A summary

Native Vegetation Regulations 2017 | 1 July 2017

Once you have established that the *Native Vegetation Act 1991* applies to your proposed clearance, use this summary of how to determine whether a regulation applies. If you find that a regulation does not apply, you can submit a clearance application under section 28 of the *Native Vegetation Act 1991*.

Table 1 below provides a brief summary of some of the actions you can do to manage native vegetation on your property.
